Did you know the Elks National Foundation helps protect the children of Elks members? The Emergency Educational Grant program provides financial assistance to the children of deceased or totally disabled Elks, who wish to obtain or further their college education. The Elk parent or stepparent must have been a member in good standing for at least one year before they passed or became totally disabled. For more information on eligibility visit enf.elks.org/eeg.

For Kyle Bort, an EEG recipient and member of the Scholar Advisory Board, the EEG was a life changer. "After my dad's passing in 2009, I was really unsure about my future", shares Kyle.

Finding funds for college daunted him. Yet the Elks offered hope. He applied for and received an EEG from the Foundation. Financial support for college was not the only thing he gained that day – he also gained a new family. When I did not even know what the ENF was, they took a chance on me!"

The Rochester Golf Club was started in 1916. It became the Rochester Country Club in 1920. Mary Pike was born in 1921. She began to play golf on this course at the age of 19 in 1941. Her husband taught her to play. She had a hole in one her first year, after which her husband told her he would no longer play with her. As Mary puts it "he didn't want me to beat him!" The Elks took over the course in 1960 but Mary, although she continued to play golf, could not become a member until 2000. (The Elks did not allow women members until the 1990's)

Over the years Mary has not only showed her proficiency as a golfer but has devoted many hours to the Lodge and the Golf Course. She ran the Pro Shop for many years as well as serving as an officer in a number of capacities.

She played her last round of golf in the 100th anniversary tournament last year. While she is no longer out on the course, it remains near and dear to her heart. What a woman!
